This quiet man of faith admits that he hasn’t always been so faithful to God. In his younger years, especially during his time in military service, it was easy for him to drift away from his beliefs and practice.

He credits his wife, Lawni with keeping him on the right track and active in faith and service. It was her influence and desire to rear their children in the faith that inspired him.
