Hear Ye, Hear Ye!!! PAVILION IN SIGHT!

Amazing and exciting!

Our church family, with a lot of faith, prayers, hard work, meetings, services, donations, tithing (both financially and of our time), fundraisers, determination, love and perseverance is on the threshold of being blessed with a beautiful pavilion on our church property. The Land Use Committee revealed the plans and proposals at the Town Hall meeting on June 25th after the Worship Service.

The proposed pavilion will measure 70ft. by 40ft. (2800 square ft), which is approximately the size of the Social Hall and the kitchen combined. When completed, it will have 2 - 15ft. by 14ft., and 1 - 15ft. by 12ft. enclosed rooms with a man door and a 6ft. by 8ft. garage door in the east end of the pavilion. The uses for these rooms will be 1) Maintenance storage, 2) Furniture storage, and 3) Prep area.

The proposed construction will include a scissor truss roof giving the ceiling a cathedral look, a 30-year metal roof, shake shingles on the gable ends, 8in. by 8in. posts, and a 2ft. overhang beyond the posts.

The proposed construction will take place in **5 phases** with the status and the proposed/estimated cost included. The Leadership Board voted on June 13th to officially approve the use of the Memorial Funds to start building the pavilion!

Phases

Phase 1 - Excavation of the property, leveling of the pavilion area with drainage and the parking area base installed is completed

Phase 2a - Setting the posts, the trusses and gable ends @ \$18,000

Phase 2b - To hire out the roofing to be installed @ \$2,500(estimate)

Phase 3 - Pour the concrete floor @ \$12,000 (with the possibility of completing sections at a time by ourselves to save \$4,000)

Phase 4 - To finish the stone for the drive and the parking lot @ \$10,000(estimated)

Phase 5 - The storage rooms to be constructed @ \$2,000

The electric and water will be installed as needed with the following costs (all are estimated):

- A) Main electric hook up @ \$1,500
- B) Wire the pavilion @ \$500
- C) Hook up to the water and tie it into the pavilion @ \$3,000

After completion

The pavilion will be able to be used by those in our church congregation and our community as a way of reaching out to our neighbors with God's love.

Sign up sheets are available in the Social Hall for those who want to be a part of this new adventure our church family is embarking upon. This pavilion will be a true blessing for many generations to come, and we all have a chance to be a part of it. Big or small parts, each is a necessary part as we are all necessary parts of Christ's church body.

Red envelopes will be available in the pockets on the back of the chairs in the sanctuary for those wishing to make a donation to the cost of the pavilion, All will be appreciated and applied where designated.


