How the Pavilion Was Started

The concept of a pavilion came soon after clearing and cleaning up the property in 2012. Early on, as we were having a Dedication Ceremony, picnics, a hot dog roast, and planned other services, we were setting up multiple tents for each. These tents were subject to damage due to weather conditions Similarly, parking was an issue when we held events in the Spring and Fall. We again were at the mercy of the weather as the grassy parking could get wet and soft, preventing parking at all.

For many events we had great weather; *however*, our biggest event was a Sunday Morning Worship Service when a storm took down part of a 50 x 80 ft. tent. Many men and women of our congregation, community, and other churches spent a lot of time erecting the tent once again in time for a small Monday Evening Service the next day.

The Land Use Committee decided a pavilion with parking would allow our congregation, other churches, and our community to use the property more often, more conveniently and more consistently.

All of the foundation concrete from the torn down buildings was used as a foundation for the parking area. Ike Clark has spent countless hours in stripping topsoil down to hard clay so we could have a firm foundation under the parking area with a similar site preparation at the pavilion.

Many men and women from our congregation provided labor, equipment, nourishment for workers, prayers, and financial support towards the land and the pavilion. The late Carl Gibbs was one of these exceptional congregation members (continued on page 5, *Pavilion...*)

Tastor's Note

Greetings Church Family,

Our hearts and prayers truly go out to those who recently have been devastated by Hurricane Harvey and those in the path of Hurricane Irma and other storms that could follow. Continue to pray for those facing these difficult natural disasters or as they begin recovery from storms that have passed still leaving them in devastation.

Even as the water subsides we know our prayers and help are needed. We can help immediately by praying and by donating money to United Methodist Committee On Relief. UMCOR uses many volunteers and the local churches in the areas of devastation as a grass roots way of meeting needs in a very efficient way. UMCOR also stays and helps in the rebuild efforts not just while the affected areas are considered a disaster area.

I myself went to D'Iberville Mississippi in the Boluxi area five times with church work teams to help families rebuild after Hurricane Katrina. Folks from Middlefield helped in D'Iberville Mississippi three times. I also went to Forked River New Jersey twice with work teams to help rebuild after Hurricane Sandy. Each time we stayed in an UMCOR operated Disaster Response center that helped coordinate disaster recovery along with the long-term rebuilding. The disaster may take hours or days to bring destruction upon the homes of families affected in a community while the recovery and rebuild could take many years.

I am hoping to build a work team with a group of volunteers from Middlefield area that would travel to Texas to help the rebuilding efforts around mid-January, 2018. Let me know if you have an interest in being part of the team. If other teams need to develop the help will be needed long term.

Let us care for those in need, may we continue to offer support in every way that the Love of Christ would be seen in His people.

The First United Methodist Church of Middlefield has purchased and cleared 15 acres of land north of Mary Yoder's Restaurant on Route 608 for the purpose of expanding its mission and ministries to the Middlefield community. The Food Pantry and Thrift Shop are in need of more space with classrooms, public meeting spaces. a banquet facility with commercial kitchen, a prayer/exercise walking path, athletic fields, additional community parking across from the high school, and more. We are almost done working on Phase 2 of our plan to build a pavilion, which will be made available for church and community activities.

The church will host the Second Annual Benefit Dinner, Silent Auction and Live Auction on Saturday, November 4th, 2017, at the Huntsburg Community Center, to accelerate the completion of the land pay-off. Doors will open at 5:30 pm for the silent auction and appetizers. Dinner will be served at 6:15 pm with bidding for the silent auction ending at 7:15 pm when the live auction begins.

Benefit Dinner tickets are \$35 each. Seating is limited. Your donation qualifies for a tax deduction, and receipts will be given for tax purposes. 


Attention all Youth!
